Introducing Abigail Lantz: Our PYO Soloist for the 2015 Winter Concerts

The PYO is proud to announce that the PYO will be performing an original composition by PYO violinist/pianist, Abby Lantz, entitled "The Emergence." Abby is a senior at the Stroudsburg High School with plans on majoring in Music Composition.

Abby expressed an interest in music at an early age. She began playing piano and singing at age 3, playing violin at age 4, and added flute to her repertoire in the 5th grade. She performed with and accompanied the SJHS and SHS show choir and the High School Musical. She was musical director and accompanist for Shawnee Playhouse this season. Abby has participated in the PFMC Festival for 12 years receiving multiple gold cups in piano, violin, voice, flute and composition. She just received her 12-year certificate and fourth gold



cup for piano, constituting 12 years of superiors. Abby has performed in Youth in Music Excellence Awards for piano, voice, and composition, having won twice for composition and once for voice. She entered the Junior Composer's Contest for 4 years and won first place in the State for 2 years, and won first place in the region, which included 6 states. Abby has studied violin with Chris Souza and is now studying piano with Scott Besser. In addition to voice and instrumental activities, Abby has been studying dance since she was four, and attends the West End Academy of Dance. Abby has been a member of PJSO/PYO since 5th grade. Abby hopes to major in Music Composition at the Berklee College of Music where she attended a summer songwriting workshop during the summer of 2014.

PYO's Trip to Carnegie Hall

The PYO is sponsoring a bus trip to hear the New York Youth Symphony perform at Carnegie Hall on Sunday, March 8, 2015. The violin soloist is Elena Urioste. You do not want to miss this.

Elena made her debut with the Philadelphia Orchestra at age 13. She was raised in Philadelphia. She decided at age 2 that she wanted to play the violin after seeing an episode of Sesame Street featuring Itzhak Perlman. Elena has appeared with the London and New York Philharmonics, the Cleveland Orchestra, the Boston Pops, and the



Chicago, Atlanta, Detroit, Pittsburgh, and National Symphony Orchestras. She was the winner of Switzerland's Sion International Violin Competition and appeared on NBC's Today Show, Telemundo, Performance Today, From the Top, and the Emmy award-winning documentary "Breaking the Sound Barrier." She plays an Alessandro Gagliano violin crafted in Naples in 1706.

What happened to my tickets?



Veteran PYO/PJSO fans may wonder why the orchestras are not selling tickets in advance of the concerts. The answer is that, with our new venue, we have more than enough seats to accommodate our existing fans. The orchestras have been performing for many years in ESU's Cecilia Cohen Fine Arts Center, which has a capacity of 300 seats. During the past several years, our concerts were sold out.

To guarantee a seat, an advance ticket was necessary. We will now be performing at the Stroudsburg High School Auditorium, with a seating capacity of 753 seats, more than double our previous venue.

Announcing the "PYO Excellency Award"

PYO Aunt, Lynn Zhang, announced that her family was so impressed with our orchestras and the talent and dedication of its students, that her family will be establishing the "PYO Excellency Award." The \$500 award will be given annually to a senior PYO student at the spring concerts. To be eligible, a scholarship applicant must meet the following criteria:

- (a) A GPA of 3.85 or above;
- (b) A PYO member for at least one year with consistent attendance at orchestra practices;
- (c) Demonstration of leadership, honesty and respect; and
- (d) Performed at least 100 hours of community service since the freshman year of high school.

A scholarship committee of the Board of Directors will select the recipient. Watch the website for the release of the application and the announcement of a deadline for submission. Our music directors and our Board thank the Zhang family for providing this generous opportunity to our students!


